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### HOW TO LEAVE YOUR LEGACY

Leaving a legacy donation in your will is a wonderful way to extend your dedication to transforming and supporting children and young people in Colombia. Your generous gifts allow us to continue our vital work with at-risk children and expand our projects across the country.

The process of leaving a legacy gift is simpler than you might think, and we're here to guide you every step of the way.

### **Prioritising Your Loved Ones**

Before considering a legacy donation to an organisation like Children Change Colombia, it's crucial to ensure your loved ones are cared for and that your will accurately reflects your wishes. Additionally, choosing a trustworthy executor for your will is essential to ensure your wishes are fulfilled in your absence. Our partnership with FreeWills.co.uk provides free advice on creating legally binding documents and they can help you with all your legal queries surrounding your will.

### How to Leave a Legacy

If you decide to leave a legacy to Children Change Colombia, you have three options:

1. Pecuniary Gift: A specific amount of money donated to CCC when your will is executed.

- Residuary Gift: A share of your estate donated to CCC after your family and loved ones have been provided for. These gifts tend to have the greatest impact, as they adjust with inflation and can reduce your inheritance tax depending on how much of your estate is left to charity.
- 3. Specific Gift: Donating specific items, such as land, shares, or possessions, to Children Change Colombia.

No gift is too small; every contribution helps us ensure a brighter future for thousands of children in Colombia.

### COLOMBIA COLORES •

### First year of 'Colombia Colores' Project

We are delighted to share the successful completion of the first year of the 'Colombia Colores' project. This initiative, aimed at bringing children from the Colombian diaspora closer to their Colombian roots, culture, traditions, and biodiversity, has been a journey filled with rich experiences, heartwarming stories, and meaningful connections. As we reach the project's conclusion, we want to reflect on our achievements, express our gratitude, and outline some final thoughts.

#### **Project Highlights**

#### Summer Workshops

This final cycle emphasised Colombian culture, complementing the previous focus on arts and nature. These workshops began with an exploration of the Wayuu, Muisca, and Arhuaco cultures. Initially, children delved into these cultures' creation myths, followed by lessons exploring their different languages and means of communication like ceremonial masks serving as inspiration for the children to create their own.

Continuing this cultural journey, the children explored the tales and classic Colombian legends of La Patasola, El Mohán, Madremonte, and El Hombre Caimán. They then delved into the beloved fables of Rafael Pombo, such as "Mirringa Mirronga, la gata candonga," setting the stage for the elements of magical realism and the enchanting yellow butterflies of Gabriel García Márquez's works.

Two special sessions were held during this cycle. The first took place during our picnic on the Thames Walk, and the second was the project's closing event, which we celebrated at an event organised by the Consulate to commemorate July 20, Colombian Independence Day.

#### School Workshops

As part of our process to involve more children, we partnered with Saint Gabriel's College, engaging a wider community interested in learning about Colombian and Latin American culture. During two consecutive Mondays, the team brought the Colombia Colores project to 15 students, who learnt about Muisca culture and explored the connections between Latin American countries through their indigenous heritage.

#### Impact and Feedback

The feedback from participants and their families has been overwhelmingly positive. Many parents expressed gratitude for the opportunity to connect their children with their cultural roots, and the 136 children that attended the sessions have shown increased interest in learning more about their Colombian heritage.

Our deepest gratitude goes to the children, parents, grandparents, and volunteers who joined us in this first year. Your support, enthusiasm, and commitment were crucial to the success of Colombia Colores. Special thanks to our project team, whose dedication and hard work made this initiative possible, and to the Colombian Consulate and City Bridge Trust for their support.

### New Project EARLY YEARS

### **Little Kangaroos**

We are pleased to share with you our new project 'Little Kangaroo' in Cartagena. With this new initiative we want to start working in early childhood and contribute to improving the health and wellbeing of premature and low birth weight babies through the implementation of the kangaroo mother method and the use of ergonomic baby carriers.

Cartagena faces high levels of poverty and inequality, significantly affecting maternal and child health. Although there has been a reduction in the maternal mortality rate, the prevalence of low birth weight has increased.

The project will focus on working with vulnerable families and includes training primary caregivers the kangaroo mother method, which encourages skin-to-skin contact and the proper use of baby carriers, facilitating nurturing contact and strengthening the bond between mother and baby. The project also includes workshops on sexual and reproductive health, prevention of second teenage pregnancies with and prevention of gender based violence.

The aim is not only to improve the health conditions of babies and their families, but also to generate evidence on the effectiveness of babywearing in vulnerable environments, thus promoting its adoption in public policies on child health. The benefits include thermal regulation, improved breastfeeding and neurological development of the baby, as well as reducing stress and improving the physical and emotional well-being of both the baby and the parents.



### Update NEW SHELTER

### **Emergency Project- New Shelter Update**

In our last newsletter we told you about our new shelter in Chocó, we are happy to share with you the progress of our emergency project. Last May after finishing the preliminary work we started the construction of the shelter. With two levels, on the second-floor family bedrooms and communal bathrooms will be permanently available to foster displaced by emergency situations; on the other hand, the first level will be a dual space, with a communal kitchen and a big community hall will serve as transitional resting place for displaced families and a share space for collective activities, such as trainings and assemblies. We hope to complete the construction process in the upcoming months and deliver a fully operational shelter to the communities before the end of the year.

At the same time, during these months we have been able to provide support to communities in emergency situations. In June, a community in the process of returning to their community after a displacement was assisted with the delivery of food and hygiene kits to 37 families. During July, 100 kits have been delivered to families in 3 communities that are in an environmental emergency. To date, 137 families in emergency situations have been assisted, this support will continue through the rest of the year.



PazA LA MOCHILA

We are very pleased to announce that last March we launched a new project on Peace Building. PazA la Mochila is a pedagogical kit for teachers and local leaders to create education spaces with children and young people to understand the complexity of the Colombian armed conflict, assessing their impact on society and mobilising society towards peacebuilding and non-repetition. This project will impact 30 institutions and 1,500 children in the first phase.

The main objective is to facilitate the diffusion and familiarity with these resources, especially in rural areas of Colombia with limited access to digital materials. This selection and adaptation process involved the review of around 30 documents, 100 activities, and various audiovisual contents, which were classified according to pedagogical focus and methodological possibilities for different age groups.

The project also looks to generate strategic alliances to disseminate it with third parties. The goal is to promote new conversations, reflections, reparative actions, reconciliation, and peacebuilding. To this end, initial steps included two meetings with the National Ministry of Education and the Colombian Institute of Family Welfare to identify potential connections.

Each mochila has didactical materials, games, books, offline contents, maps among others, including peace doves sewed in crochet by single head of household mothers.

The project is framed in the Truth Commission (CdV) Final Report submitted in 2022, which left behind a legacy of tools dedicated to peacebuilding, with the purpose.

The Truth Commission's pedagogical framework includes three moments:

- Zoom in to learn: Informative activities about the armed conflict and its implications, encouraging introspection and relational connections with emotions, experiences, and thoughts as individuals and groups.
- Articulation and social mobilisation: Connecting schools with communities to work together.
- Create to transform: Promoting participation and change agency through artistic and cultural manifestations, both of them focus on peace building and nonrepetition.







For Children Change Colombia it is important to strengthen the pedagogical skills of educational agents through the use of the PazA la Mochila kit. We have already implemented a pre pilot in 4 rural schools in the Magdalena region with teachers and children from primary and secondary levels. These workshops were an opportunity to validate the kit as a relevant material for peacebuilding.

The workshops had significant participation. Teachers acknowledged their crucial role in leading and co-creating, with an emphasis on recognizing and respecting diversity and differing opinions to achieve common goals.

The children's Pre-pilot also had a positive reception, not only corporal exercises, including relaxation and meditation, were liked and valued as novel experiences but the use of open spaces, natural materials, and new elements were validated for the groups as successful initiatives. In general, participants recognised the need for safe spaces where thoughts and feelings can be shared with classmates.

Finally, what are the next steps? We are working on designing and producing all of the contents and didactic materials, especially the pedagogical guide, which will be the compass to navigate this path. Our goal is to enhance sessions with a creative ambiance, encouraging exploration beyond traditional teaching methods, and creating meaningful connections between PazA la Mochila and everyday life within families and communities.

As part of our advocacy workPazA la Mochila will come to the UK in November 2024. Stay tuned to attend one of the sessions we will be giving in English and Spanish.



### EDUCATION ANGELS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME UPDATE



Thank you very much! We have reached our target of 16 Angels to support our first group of rural students to study a bachelor's degree. Thanks to our alliances with Politécnico Grancolombiano and Fundación Universitaria del Area Andina, we are able to provide students with full scholarships to study bachelor's degrees. The students will also receive personal computers, an internet allowance, money to visit the university campus, and psychosocial support to help them to succeed through their five years of study.

The Angels have attended the online sessions with the scholars and received the first report of their academic and life progress. We have good news: Keiner and Gizeth, our first two scholars, who are studying Law and Psychology, got excellent academic results in their first semester at Uni. María and Andres have already started their university studies in August and we have also identified one outstanding student, Denis, who will start her studies in January 2025. 
